## WARD Session Outline

### Overarching Aims:

- To encourage an effective, systematic, team based approach to the management of the acutely unwell patient using DRABCDEF.
- To encourage participants to call for help early in the setting of patient deterioration, reinforcing the importance of escalation to senior medical and nursing staff.
- To explore Crisis Resource Management principles in the context of an interprofessional team managing a deteriorating patient

### Learning Objectives:

At the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Describe the A – E approach for assessment and initial management of the acutely unwell patient
- Practice a structured approach to assessment and management of a clinically deteriorating patient
- Outline key aspects of effective communication and clinical handover in the management of the deteriorating patient
- Outline ways to stabilise patient physiology in the first 5/60
- Discuss aspects of effective teamwork in the management of the deteriorating patient including leadership/followership, communication and role allocation

### Location of Monash Simulation Centre

Monash Simulation is located at the Moorabbin Hospital, 823-865 Centre Road, East Bentleigh.

Enter via the main hospital entrance, walk past Central Easts and the main reception, turn right past Monash Breast screen, follow the corridor past Outpatients 1C.
